GENERAL MESSAGE – LATEST QLD BORDER CONTROL MEASURES

Queensland border restrictions and entry passes for agriculture

Revised QLD border control measures were introduced by the Queensland Government on 3 April 2020 in response to COVID-19.

Following a request from Industry, the Queensland government has since <u>published</u> information on how these new measures impact agricultural businesses and the steps that are needed to follow to minimise potential delays.

The new requirements require specific actions from:

- **BORDER WORKERS** This impacts Queensland feedlots close to the state border who have employees who reside in another state and travel to work across the border.
- AGRIBUSINESS WORKERS COMING FROM INTERSTATE This impacts Queensland feedlots
 who have consultants, such as a veterinarian or nutritionist, who reside in or travel from
 other states to visit their facility.
