# Grain fed cattle numbers rise 9%

Results from the latest ALFA/ MLA quarterly feedlot survey showed a 9% rise in cattle numbers on feed to 873,000 head.

Australian Lot Feeders' Association (ALFA) President Don Mackay commented that the June quarter survey outcome was predominantly the result of a decline in feeder cattle prices as grass fed producers in several states destocked due to drier than average seasonal conditions".

"Feeder cattle prices started the June quarter with a continuation of the easing from the March quarter, before bottoming out in mid-May, and then recovering through June".

"The yearling steer (C2 330-400 kg lwt) category averaged 167¢/kg lwt for the quarter, back 5% from the March quarter and 16% year-on-year".

"The highest numerical quarterly increase in cattle numbers on feed was experienced in Queensland (11%) as dry conditions in the Northern Territory and the Western parts of the state led to higher turnoff figures".

"However, increases were also felt in Victoria (26%), South Australia (8%) and WA (39%) due to cheaper feeder cattle and/ or grain (particularly when compared to the northern states)".

"NSW lot feeders were unable to take advantage of cheaper cattle from Queensland and the Northern territory due mainly to transport costs".

"Rises in feed grain prices dampened further increases in cattle numbers on feed (particularly during the latter part of the quarter) with Darling Downs barley (\$298/tonne), sorghum (\$283/tonne) and wheat (\$297/tonne) year-on-year prices up 49%, 57% and 39% respectively".

Meat & Livestock Australia's Manager for Market Information and Analysis, Tim McRae stated that "grain fed exports for the quarter were up 8% compared to the corresponding period last year".

"Total grain fed exports for 2012/13 were 198,158 tonnes swt, up 2% year-on-year, and 5% on the five-year average with the declines into Japan (6%) and Korea (1%) more than offset by significant increases to the EU and China (82% and 429% respectively).


