Grain fed cattle numbers down

Results from the latest ALFA/ MLA September quarter survey showed a 9% decline in cattle numbers on feed compared to the last quarter, though similar numbers year-on-year.

Australian Lot Feeders' Association (ALFA) President Don Mackay commented that the decline was predominantly driven by higher feed grain prices (particularly in southern states) and continued sluggish export demand.

"Feed barley and wheat prices in the Riverina increased by 18% and 34% respectively over the quarter whilst a resilient dollar, US competition and continued difficult economic conditions in our major export markets stymied any chance for beef demand growth."

"Higher feed grain prices largely reflected the impact of the ongoing drought on the US corn crop, with higher increases experienced in southern states as prices became more aligned with those seen in other parts of Australia."

"Cattle numbers on feed increased in Queensland, bucking the trends seen in other states, as lower feeder cattle prices at the end of the quarter offset grain price rises."

"Whilst Queensland yearling steers on average rose 2% for the quarter, feeder cattle prices (particularly for lighter domestic cattle) declined in September, as drier seasonal conditions forced increased numbers onto the market."

Meat & Livestock Australia's Manager for Market Information and Analysis, Tim McRae stated that "grain fed beef exports totalled 50,683 tonnes swt in the September quarter - 7% lower year-on-year, underpinned by weak Japanese and Korean demand."

"Grainfed exports to Japan fell 4% year-on-year during the September quarter, to 33,801 tonnes swt whilst shipments to Korea finished the September quarter 23% below year ago levels at 7,776 tonnes swt."

"Unfortunately, the Australian dollar remained strong against the currencies of our major markets averaging US\$1.04 over the quarter (1% down year-on-year), flat against the Japanese Yen and 3% higher against the Korean Won."

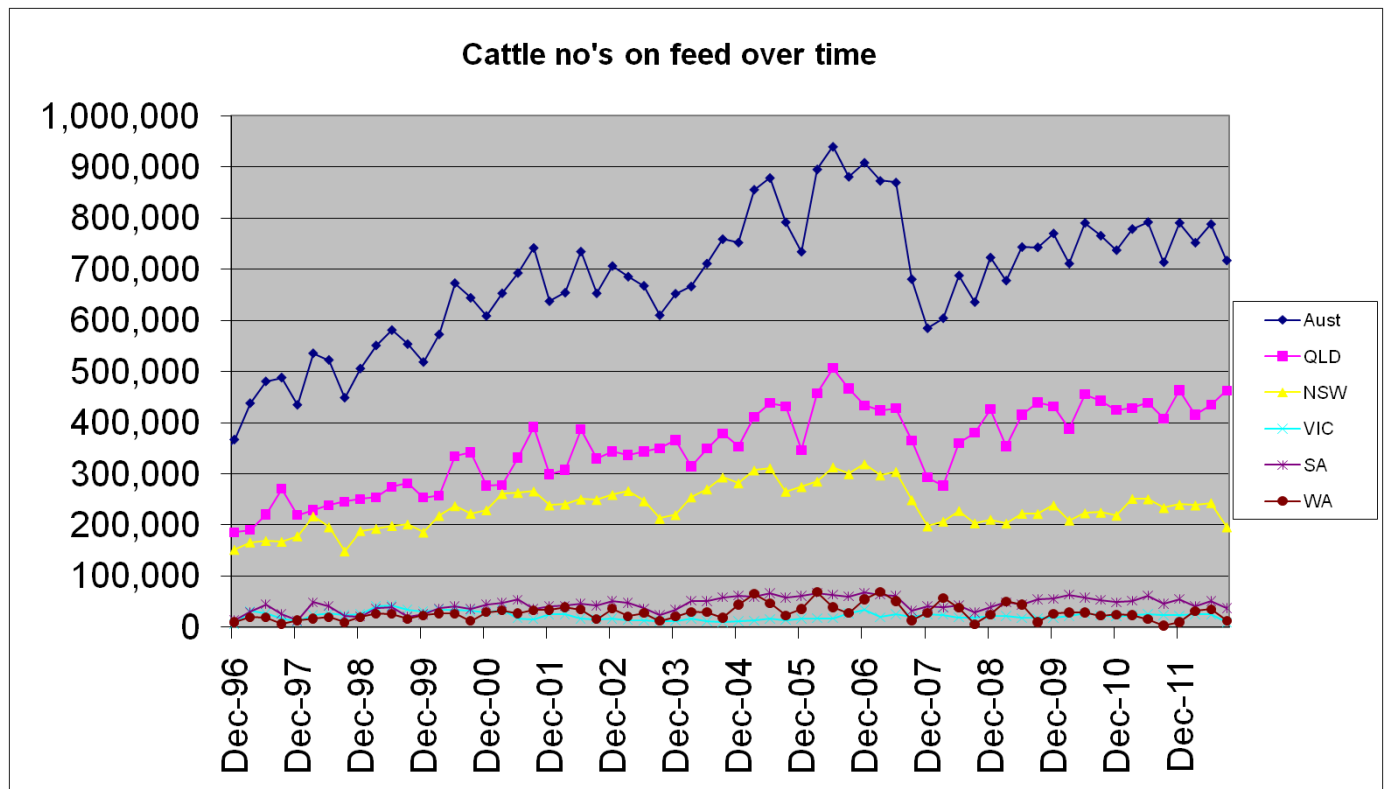

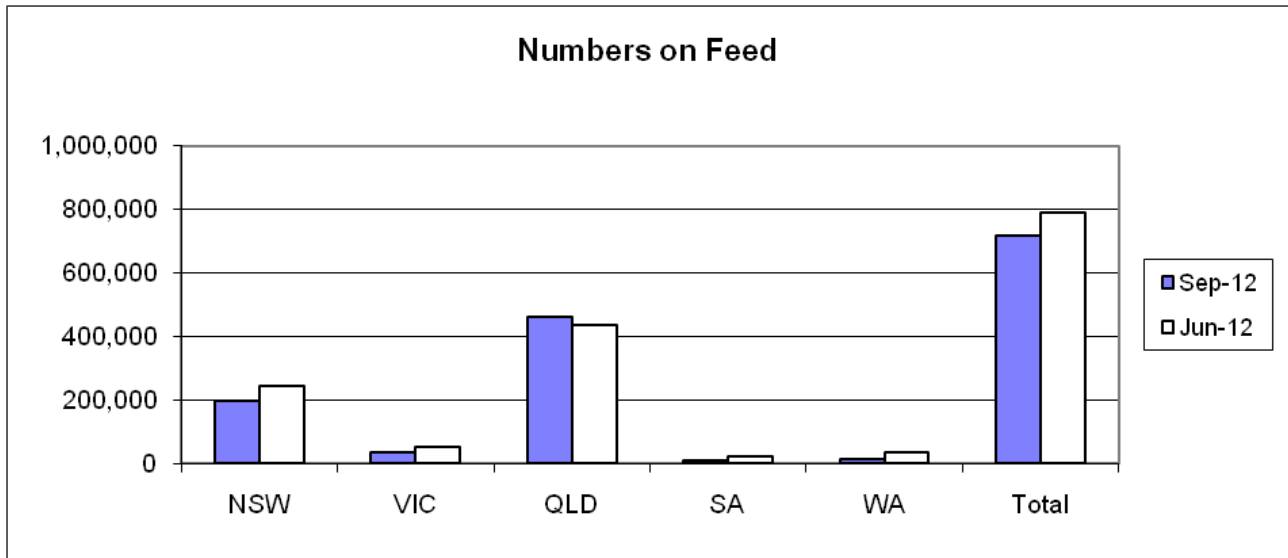
